

Background

IPPF engaged Birches Group to perform a benchmarking analysis of the top thirty (30) positions in the organization. This group is the leadership of IPPF and consists of positions at the Director level or equivalent, and above. This report summarizes the results of the benchmarking analysis.

In addition, IPPF asked Birches Group to do an overall assessment of the broader organization, specifically, how competitive pay levels are across the entire organization. This report contains *preliminary* data to address this question.



Approach and Methodology

Birches Group followed a three-step methodology to perform the benchmarking for the top thirty positions.

- Step 1 Job evaluation
- Step 2 Matching to market data
- Step 3 Summarize results

Each of these steps is described in more detail below.



Job Evaluation

Job evaluation is the process used by organizations to determine the contribution value of a job to their organization and establish equivalent worth between different jobs in different occupations across the organization.

For this project, we evaluated each of the thirty positions using the Birches Group Community™ methodology, which consists of fourteen distinct levels of contribution divided into four clusters (General, Process, Design and Leadership).

Three factors are assessed: *Purpose, Engagement and Delivery.*





Job Evaluation (2)

For each job evaluated, a *value* for each of the three factors is assigned.

The results are then combined to determine a final job level (BG-1 through BG-14)

The thirty jobs all fell between BG-11 and BG-14 except for the CEO position, which was assessed as BG-15 (reserved for senior leadership roles).

Market Data

In order to make a market comparison, it is necessary to "match" the IPPF roles to jobs reported in market surveys. For this project, we used the Birches Group NGO Global Pay Survey, which aims to measure the broad global market for senior leaders and experts within the international NGO sector. This is the market in which IPPF recruits for top talent.

The market captured by the survey consists of positions recruited internationally and includes data at headquarters locations as well as field-based positions. While many incumbents in the survey may have international or expatriate status, the data in the survey excludes expatriate allowances and benefits. Most organizations in the survey are headquartered in the US or Europe.

A list of the fifty-five (55) survey participants is on the next page. Comparators represent a broad range of international NGO organizations across many different program focus areas.

Matching to Market Data

The "BG-level" determined in the job evaluation step is used to associate the market data to each IPPF position. The IPPF data was averaged by BG-level and compared to different market positions.

The analysis shows the range in the market for the 50th, 75th and 90th percentiles.

We have *estimated* the approximate percentile the IPPF data represents, indicating the relative strength of IPPF's compensation to the market.



Summary of Results

 By level, the estimated market position is as follows:

 The overall average market position of IPPF (weighted by headcount) is at the 50th percentile



Overall Organization Market Assessment

IPPF also requested Birches Group assess the overall market position of the entire organization at all levels in all locations. In this section, we present the results of this analysis.

It is important to note this analysis should be considered *preliminary*, as there was insufficient time to apply our usual quality control processes to the data received from IPPF. As part of ongoing work scheduled over the next three months, Birches Group will update and refine these results.

Summary of Overall Market Position

This chart compares IPPF data to the market. A value of 100 indicates IPPF is fully competitive at the designated percentile.

Values *above* or *below* 100 indicate the percentage above or below the market (e.g., 93.3 for Europe indicates the IPPF average is 93.3% of the 50th percentile value).

At the 50th percentile, IPPF is competitive in most markets, except for Malaysia and Fiji. IPPF Africa is very competitive at the 75th percentile as well.

It is important to note that this data will be updated during the project, and a specific group of the most relevant comparators will be identified and used to represent the market. This will likely change the reported market positions.

Observations


IPPF historical practices have resulted in eight different approaches for compensation and benefits. With the formation of One Secretariat, IPPF needs a global job structure consistently applied in all locations, and salary structures for each region designed using a common philosophy and approach. The ongoing work Birches Group will be performing in the next three months is designed to provide such a solution.

Whenever significant changes are made to something as fundamental as the compensation system, there will be challenges and transition steps will be required to ensure the implementation of the new approach is done in a fair, equitable and compliant manner.
